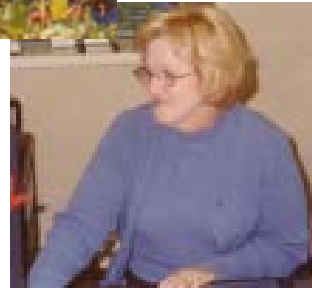

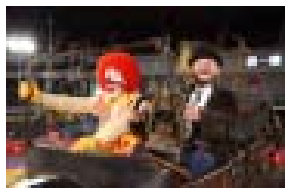

DALLAS BURN SOCCER

The Dallas Burn of Major League Soccer has called the Cotton Bowl home since the team's inaugural season in 1996. In seven years of MLS play, the Burn is one of the only two teams in the league to have qualified for the playoffs every year. The 2002 season for the Burn was a success both on and off the field.

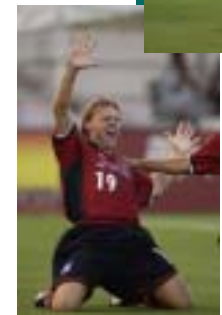
Highlights in '02:

- Final attendance average of 13,122 was the highest average since 1996, and was 4% higher than the 2001 season average. Attendance average has increased 36% since 1997.

- With 43 points on the season, the Burn finished third overall in the league, a feat also accomplished in 1999. Their .554 winning percentage was second-best in the league.

- The team finished with their second-best record at 12-9-7. Three games over .500 marked the second highest mark in team history (six games over .500 in 1999).

- The nine losses tied Los Angeles for the fewest losses in the league.

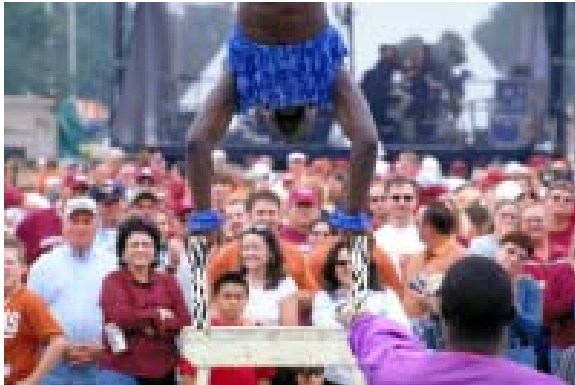

2002 STATE FAIR OF TEXAS

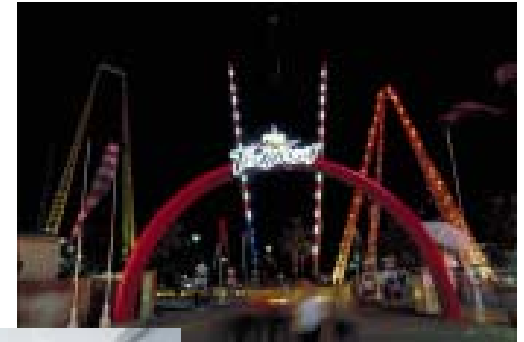

State pride is on the line each year when the stadium is divided into distinct camps of crimson and burnt orange.

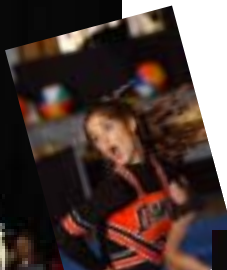
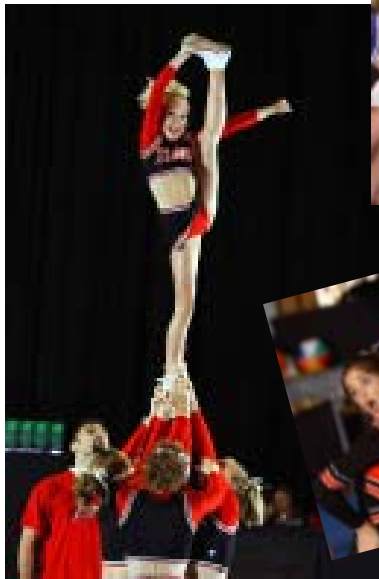

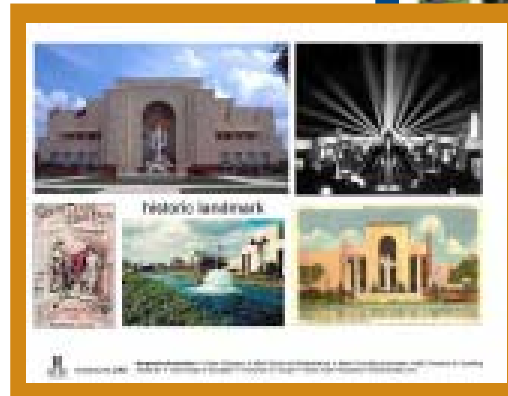


FAIR PARK COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN ...
