Veteran journalist to be featured at final Authorspeak program

Ted Fishman's book on China has become an international best-seller

Dallas, TX – A leading expert on the People's Republic of China and its development as a world power is the final speaker in the Dallas Public Library and the World Affairs Council of Dallas/Fort Worth Authorspeak series. Ted Fishman, author of *China, Inc.: How the Rise of the Next Superpower Challenges America and the World* will speak Thursday, March 6 at the Dallas Central Library, 1515 Young St.

Fishman's essays and reports have appeared in *The New York Times Magazine*, *Money*, *Harper's*, *Esquire*, *USA Today*, *GQ* and *Chicago* magazine. A former floor trader and member of the Chicago Mercantile Exchange, he ran his own trading firm until 1992. His bestselling book describes the effects of China's recent emergence as a world power on the lives and businesses of people across the globe.

A visiting scholar at Stanford University's Center on Longevity, Fishman is also a director of a program for global executives run by Dartmouth's Tuck School of Business in Shanghai.

After a 6 p.m. reception, the program will begin at 6:30 p.m. in the Central Library's first floor auditorium. Admission is \$20 for members of the World Affairs Council and Friends of the Library, and \$30 for non-members.
