Chickens, bees and trees, oh my! **Dallas Public Library celebrates World Environment Day June 5**

DALLAS – The Dallas Public Library will celebrate World Environment Day with a free event from 1 to 5 p.m. Saturday, June 5 at the Central Library, 1515 Young St. The United Nations founded World Environment Day in 1972 to stimulate environmental awareness and action.

“Visitors to our World Environment Day celebration can learn how to raise backyard chickens and see a “chicken condo” and the Texas Honeybee Guild will be on hand to talk about the joys and challenges of keeping bees,” said Assistant Library Director Miriam Rodriguez.

Other activities will include a used book sale; film screenings and an environmental fair and presentations from the Dallas Urban Forest Advisory Committee, the City’s Bicycle Coordinator and the Dallas Farmers Market.
